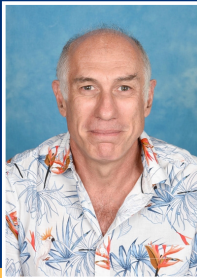

The Maali Centre

CHANGEOVER OF CLASSES

FINDING YOUR WAY AROUND

- Governor Stirling Senior High School is a very large building with many areas and rooms for you to get to know.

LOWER SCHOOL STUDENT AREAS

The central courtyard is for lower school students in Year 7, 8 and 9 to use during all breaks and before school.

Ball sports are not allowed in these areas and can only be played on the Hockey Oval or Courts.

HOCKEY OVAL/COURTS

You may use the Hockey Oval and Courts for playing games during breaks. Games with potential for injury such as Touch Rugby are not allowed. No food or drinks are to be taken into these areas.

 - If you feel strongly about something that has happened put up your hand and ask the teacher if you can talk about it with them at the end of the lesson or arrange a time to come back and talk with your teacher.
 - If this does not happen and you still feel you need to talk about it, go see your Year Coordinator.
